

Council Gorner



Sacrifice occurs when an individual acts without self interest for the sake of higher values and commitments. We have been reading in the book of Leviticus about different types of sacrifices the Israelites performed. Burnt offerings, grain offerings, peace offerings, and sin offerings all used to atone for various transgressions against God. Yet most of us don't think about sacrifice in these terms. We are more likely to think of sacrifice in terms of our time, labor and treasure. We link sacrifice with love. We sacrifice for people and values that we love. Jesus loves us so deeply that Jesus sacrificed life for us. Yes, Jesus sacrificed life for us because of the deep love Jesus felt for us. As you let that sink in, you can see how this deep love, this unconditional love, provides us with unremitting forgiveness. We are so blessed. Most of you sacrifice your time, labor and treasury on behalf of our church because you love God and the people that worship at Falmouth Congregational Church. Your sacrifice brings our church community closer to each other and deepens our relationship with God. And speaking for the church as a whole, we are forever thankful for the sacrifices and the love that you give to the Falmouth Congregational Church.

We have faith, we have community and most of all we have the gift of enduring love Christ gives us. What joy we experience with Jesus and all of you in our lives!

What is the Council Doing Now?

At our March Council meeting we discussed these items:

I) We discussed different ways of providing transportation for those who need a ride to Sunday services and for the transportation needs of our growing youth group. In the past the church owned a small bus that volunteer church members drove each Sunday to transport a few congregants to Sunday service. The bus was also used for the occasional church outing. During Covid the bus sat idle and the decision was made to sell the bus and put the proceeds back into the bus fund which was generously donated to the church years ago. Moving forward, the council has decided to set up a formal church driving program that matches congregants who need a ride to church with those willing to drive a congregant to church. Thankfully, we currently have several congregants already giving rides to church. Formalizing the ride program will provide additional insurance coverage for the drivers. Stay tuned for announcements about this program. The council approved the use of the interest generated by the bus fund to cover the cost of rental vans for youth group and church outings. In summary, the ride share program utilizes personal vehicles that ergonomically work better for older congregants. And rental vans will be used for youth group outings eliminating the cost of purchasing a bus, maintenance and insurance. The rental fees will be paid for by the interest generated by the bus fund.

- 2) The lower level renovation project was discussed and we specifically looked at ways to reduce the current projected cost submitted by Wright Ryan builders. Committee members Rodney Coleman and Jud Cleveland suggested the church get estimates from individual contractors for the various aspects of the project. Jud Cleveland has gratefully offered to reach out to builders and contractors he has worked with to get estimates. Within a few weeks we should have these figures and be able to determine the scope of what is achievable with the generously donated funds we have for this renovation.
- 3) We discussed and approved the purchase of a new computer to replace one of the aging church office computers.
- 4) The new sound system for the sanctuary that was announced last month will be installed in April. The new system replaces our aging 25 year old system. It will significantly improve functionality, adds additional microphones, reduces the amount of wires on the floor, repairs the monitor speaker for the choir (so they can hear their singing and the sermon), and repairs the speakers in Fellowship Hall. We are assured there will be no disruption of our Sunday services as the new system is installed.
- 5) The council was informed of necessary repair work on our fire sprinkler system. This work will take place this spring. It is an expensive repair that should last about one to two weeks. This repair is necessary to keep our system functional and to achieve code approval necessary for our child care renters.

Stay tuned, our next council meeting is Sunday, April 14.

Pastor's Discretionary Fund

The church keeps a confidential community fund for people experiencing financial emergencies. Over the past year we have used it to do things like:

- Put new tires on the car of a mom escaping domestic violence
- Pay the cell phone bill for a family that had a medical emergency & was facing shut off
- Pay multiple heating and electric bills for families facing shut off
- Put families or singles up in a hotel room for a few nights until they could be placed in a shelter
- Put gas in a families RV so they could make it out of state to get help
- Buy food cards and bus passes for people in acute need
