#### From the Pastor:

This spring has been a time of uncertainty and anxiety. The COVID-19 virus has caused cancellations and closures, and made us all newly aware of how quickly life can change. Since we cannot gather in person we are finding new ways to worship, logging into Facebook Live and watching service on Youtube—who knew FCC would be on "TV" in 2020!

During this same time we have experienced the loss of longtime beloved community members, as well as many poignant anniversaries from losses in previous years. Many in our church family have been ill, injured, or undergone medical procedures and the long periods of recovery that follow.

As we walk through these changes and challenges, I am reminded of wisdom from the author Barbara Brown Taylor, who wrote that to understand the truth of the resurrection "you do not have to die... you only need to lose track of who you are, or who you thought you were supposed to be, or how you thought things were supposed to go, so that you end up lying flat on the dirt floor basement of your heart."

Perhaps you have had moments of laying in your heart's basement this spring, moments of worry where the darkness seemed to be overtaking the light. These feelings are a valid part of our experience—the church honors and acknowledges this, especially during Holy Week, when we spend time in contemplation, acknowledging the reality of the tomb.

But the Christian story does not end there. It pulls our attention, again and again, to the light at the edges of the door, to the cracks in the stone over the tomb. It insists that there is more to the story—more hope than we dream possible, more love than we can comprehend. Just as the flowers break through ground that was once covered in ice, and birds sing where the forest was silent, Christ arises from the tomb, and reminds us that there is nothing—no darkness, grief, virus, or shortcoming—that will separate us from the love of God.



Whether we are meeting in person or virtually, on Easter morning we will cry out, as our Christian ancestors did before us, "Death, O Where is your victory? Death, O Where is your sting?" and we will remember together that Easter promise, that we will be risen, risen indeed!

### Council Corner

I am sure you have been getting many, many emails on what is going on in our community about containing the spread of the COVID 19 virus. As most of you know, we took the advice of Governor Mills and the Maine UCC Conference and will be worshiping virtually on Sunday mornings for at least the next two weeks (more info on how to join in coming soon!).

The church is closed, but we are operating remotely and supporting our community in many ways during this challenging time, including checking in on the vulnerable among us, offering remote worship and church school opportunities, and working together to make sure that all have the emotional and practical support they need. For the safety of our community the Forever Growing children's program, Aerobics, Fiddle-icious, and other rental activities that contribute to the church have been temporarily suspended.

## Annual Egg Hunt Cancelled

The event is traditionally held the day before Easter Sunday, which this year would have been Saturday, April 11th. Event coordinator, Craig Page, stated, "Cancelling the event is in line with both CDC guidance and guidance of Maine's Governor. The egg hunt typically draws a crowd in excess of over 600 people." The CDC has issued coronavirus guidance of not holding events which exceed 50 people for the next 8 weeks and Governor Janet Mills stated that events which exceed 50 people should not be held until further notice.

The Church's pastor, Amelia Edison, said, "While disappointing, we have a responsibility to do what we can to protect our attendees, volunteers, and vendors. We have to do our part to be responsible to the public." She optimistically added, "However, the reason for the Easter Season has not been cancelled. As it has been for the past 2000 years, we will all still have a Happy Easter!"

Page said the church is already planning for next year's egg hunt. He says the church will be a doubling down due to the cancellation of this year's event resulting in a Super Egg Hunt next year. Falmouth Congregational Church is not alone in cancelling an Easter Egg event. The White House recently announced the cancellation the its traditional Easter Egg Roll.


