Advent is a time of waiting for God. It is also a time of God waiting for us. In Advent God waits for us to say Yes to Jesus's coming, and ready our hearts, lives, homes, and world for the Prince of Peace.

The Christmas story depends on ordinary people saying Yes. Mary said Yes to carrying God in her body. Joseph, warned only in a dream, said yes too. The shepherds saw angels in the sky and dared to believe the promise of their songs, leaving everything behind. The Wise Ones saw a star, and set out bearing gifts.

Advent invites us into the story: we are called to be brave like Mary, kind like Joseph, daring like the shepherds, and generous like the wise ones. Advent is a time for saying yes to God; a time of saying yes to finding our place in the story.

The Advent season here at Falmouth UCC offers many opportunities to say Yes. Each Sunday we will ready our hearts for Christmas through prayer, music, and worship. At home we invite you to travel with the Advent: Say Yes take home devotional and an Advent spotify playlist. In addition you could Move through Advent with the Gospel of Matthew (more on next page). Our Church School Families will learn the Christmas story an envelope a day with their take home advent calendars. We will revel and sing at the second annual Christmas Spectacular and decorate the Sanctuary as we hang the Chrismons together. And, for those for whom this season is bitter sweet, we offer the contemplative Longest Night service as a salve against what can be a difficult season.

It is our hope that, together, we can say Yes to God, and let God's coming change us, so that we are ready to feasting at God's table, a table of Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace without end.



The ushers are the host for that Sunday

Watch for needs-childcare, late arrivals, coloring, and anything that requires the attention of staff (or our local police)

- Greet and orient new people (bathrooms, nursery care, hello)
- Pass out bulletins
- Keep a count of how many people are in worship (done during first hymn)
- Pass the plates during the offering
- Help tidy the Sanctuary after worship

#### PASTOR'S REPORT:

#### Next Generation Leadership Initiative

In November I spent a week in Chicago receiving leadership training and professional development through the Next Generation Leadership Initiative (NGLI). This is my second year of this five year program.

NGLI is a leadership development initiative of the national United Church of Christ that equips, energizes, and empowers younger UCC local church pastors to build vibrant congregations that change lives and further God's mission in the world. It seeks to honor and challenge clergy who have accepted the high calling to parish ministry, who demonstrate significant potential, and who view parish ministry as a career path and are willing to make a long-term commitment to service in congregational settings of the United Church of Christ.

My time in Chicago was energizing. We focused on Vitality, and what it means to be a vital church and a vital church leader. I relish being able to learn beside other dedicated, smart, and faithful Pastors.



I came away with a clearer understanding of what Vitality looks like: It is a spirit-filled, Christ centered place. It can get easy to get distracted by other things but, fundamentally, Jesus is what we have, in the Church; Jesus is the reason we exist. When we focus on that we are clear on our Why, and that makes the What is easier.
