




Question 2: Professional-quality traditional choral music belongs in our Church services




Question 3: Lay parishioners should have regular opportunities to sing or play instruments




Question 4: Would your family be interested in singing or playing an instrument?




Question 5: Music in Church should primarily emphasize traditional, organ based hymns such as from our current Hymnal (Chalice Hymnal):




Question 6: Congregational singing be accompanied primarily by pipe organ




Question 7: Music program should offer opportunities for children and teens to perform during services.


