A Message from our Moderator

Hi – I hope everyone is doing well and enjoying summer!

A quick update on our financials. Through May we are just about breaking even. For the five months ended in May, we reported income of \$118k and a net loss of \$219. We did incur some unexpected parsonage repair expenses in May and that offset the \$4k we had in net income through April. We will continue to monitor finances over the summer.

We are actively looking for a few volunteers to chair/co-chair the Holly Days Fair. As many of you know the Holly Days Fair generates substantial income for the church – typically north of \$10k. And given that restrictions are easing, COVID cases are declining, and many people are vaccinated, we are hoping to hold a more traditional event this year. But right now, we are without a Chairperson. In the past the fair has been run with a single chair, co-chairs and even trichairs. If anyone is interested in chairing or co-chairing this very important fundraiser, please let me know. Our prior tri-chairs have offered to help with the transition and provide some mentorship to the incoming chair(s).

The kitchen renovation is moving right along and we hope that it will be complete by mid to late July.

The Council will be taking July and August off and resume meeting again in September. Many blessings,

Summer 2021 Musical Opportunities

So much has changed because of the pandemic. We are now carefully easing our way back into full congregational singing, and our target date for us all to be singing hymns is early August. So, in addition to anyone willing to perform a Prelude or Special Music, we are also looking for people willing to sing hymns for any of the services from July 4 -July 25, inclusive. You could sing one hymn, both, or all eight if you were just on fire about this opportunity. Doris would be glad to accompany you on organ or piano, or Virginia on guitar, or you might have access to yet other musicians to help you out. Maybe even you could accompany yourself, depending on what you play.

Your performances - hymns and/or Preludes/Special Music - could be live or prerecorded. Stringed instruments on their own do not have those restrictions. For those of you who would rather record, the easiest way is to touch base with Virginia for a quick refresher.
