# **SEEKING: Honest Questions for Deeper Faith**

Dear Falmouth Congregational Church,

I am still smiling after a fabulous Annual Meeting where we heard about the planned renovation of our downstairs classrooms, elected new officers, approved the budget, heard about the plans of our marketing committee and sang Amazing Grace— in 4 part harmony! Read all about it in the <u>Annual Report</u>.

This Sunday we will bless our Guiding Words for the year ahead, praying that we will be led closer to wholeness, goodness, and peace (e.g. Christ) in 2023.

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of Lent. This year the Lenten Scripture readings offer us stories of Jesus encountering people who are seeking: Nicodemus, the woman at a well, a man in need of healing. Each of these people is longing for a new beginning, a different life, a deeper faith. In this season we, too, will engage in the spiritual practice of seeking, centering each Sunday around a question found in these Scripture Passages. All are invited to attend a Lenten Supper; over a simple meal of soup and bread meal we will take turns thinking with open ended questions and sharing our experiences of faith.

Our questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Ultimately, we pray that our insights might lead to a new beginning, a restoration, and a wider grace. That is the purpose of Lent-we seek so that we may find Easter.

I look forward to journeying together.



By the time you read this, the families will have left Williston Immanuel and moved to Trinity Episcopal. Although the volunteers heard from me soon after we housed the families through the 28 of December, I want to express my gratitude to the church for being so open and offering the space to these families. Many different people volunteered but not just from our church. We housed the families over Christmas with most of the kids participating in the Christmas pageant. We were able to provide gifts to each of the kids and parents (6 parents and 13 kids) when Santa visited on Christmas Eve.



This was truly a great example of our mission work on a very local level. If you have access, there was an article written in the Forecaster: https://www.pressherald.com/2022/12/27/room-at-the-inn-falmouth-congregation-takes-in-asylum-seeking-families/

When we found out that the shelter food was not that good and the families started cooking in our kitchen, many of you jumped in with Hannaford gift cards to help with groceries. You met the need when we needed more blankets and a few pairs of boots so their feet would be warm.



The problem of homelessness is getting worse. The family shelter in Portland is experiencing a tremendous overflow of families. There is a lot of work going on at the local as well as the state level. There is a lot of thought being given to larger spaces closer to Portland that could house more families. On a positive side, there is new housing coming available in early 2023. Until then, I fully expect that we will see these or new families again at Falmouth Congregational Church. It is always sad, as we grow close to the families staying at the church. If we see them again, it means they haven't found an apartment. The very best outcome is that we see new families.


