#### **COUNCIL CORNER FOR FEBRUARY**

(This month's Council Corner was written before the Annual Meeting and will be published after, so readers will know more than the writer does now about what happened at the Annual Meeting).

December and January are usually busy months for the Church Council of Ministries, as the annual stewardship campaign wraps up; the budget for the upcoming year is finalized and planning for the Annual Meeting and Annual Report is completed. This year was even more active, because the Council meetings in December and January focused on a long-discussed proposal to install a rooftop solar array that would meet all of the Church's need for electricity and make us better stewards of God's green earth. The January meeting also focused on a concept plan for renovating the Church kitchen.

The Council decided to present both the solar proposal and the kitchen renovation concept to the Congregation at Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 26. Regarding the solar project, the Council voted to ask the Congregation to authorize the Church enter into a contract with Goggin Energy, a local provider of solar and other alternative energy installations. Thanks to the efforts and generosity of dedicated Church members, we have already raised enough in pledges to cover most of the cost of the solar installation. The kitchen renovation is still in the brainstorming/concept stage, but the Annual Meeting will include a presentation on the ideas generated to date.

On the stewardship front, we are closing in on our goal, thanks to the commitment of so many members and friends of the Church.

Our Church is on the move--new members are joining, the Church school is growing, so many good things are happening in our midst. Praise God and rejoice!




