

### Dear Falmouth UCC,

January is a time of visioning— we set goals, take stock, and dream about what the next year might hold. It is the church season of Epiphany; we focus on the star that proclaimed Jesus's arrival and purpose in the world.

It is a perfect time to take on a project to grow ourselves and our faith, and we are doing just that; in 2024 we will be reading the Bible together—cover to cover. If you choose to participate you can pick up a Bible reading plan—on top of the piano in Fellowship Hall—or download the Read Scripture App—www.readscripture.org. The app also has weekly videos from The Bible Project. Whether or not you dive into the daily reading the sermons this year will follow the whole ark of the Bible so we can glimpse this unified story (song/poem/letter/dream), written in many voices and in many times, that leads to Jesus the Christ.

You do not need to read the whole Bible this year, but I hope you do. I hope you do because I think it gives Christians a sense of ownership, to have read every word in our Scripture. I think it also gives us an understanding of how incredible— and incredibly complex— our Scriptures are. The Bible is a masterpiece. And, it is a collection of so many people's experiences with God, and life— some terrible, some beautiful, some infuriating, some breathtaking. In reading all of those voices, layered on top of each other, we learn so much about the human experience, Divine encounters, and our own selves. We learn much, and also understand how much more there could be to learn— it is both empowering and humbling.

We will spend January meditating on the power of language, both through Bible study and through our annual tradition of choosing Guiding Star Words- One Word to symbolize what we hope God will be doing in our lives in this year ahead.

### **Proposed Sabbatical Overview**

**Theme:** Selah- A holy pause to re-connect and renew in prayer, Scripture, and connection This time of holy pause will be focused on renewing my prayer and faith practices so that I can return to the congregation able to lead centered firmly and deeply in our Lord Jesus Christ.

### Timeframe:

Leave after/on "Sending Off Sunday" June 2, 2024 – Return September 1, 2024 (Church School and full programing resuming September 8)

### **Coverage:**

FCC UCC Minster of Children & Families, Lydia Hoffman, will preach and preside the first, second, and third Sundays of the month. She will continue the Scriptural focus of 2024 where we will be preaching and reading through the Bible. It is my hope that the Congregation will spend 2024 grounding itself even more deeply in Scripture and spiritual practices so that we can journey together. In April or May I will lead a small group to prepare Lay Preachers who would like to share their experience and insight from six months of consistent Bible reading in lay sermons the remaining ~four Sundays. Depending on how many people are interested in giving lay sermons we can also get pulpit coverage from the Maine UCC.

### **Broad overview:**

I will spend June, July and August in rural Maine and spend time each day in prayer, Bible study, and also engage in a running practice, which I find spiritually grounding. Concurrently I will be enrolled in an online course with the Society of Saint John the Evangelist *Crafting a Rule of Life* which brings monastic principles to the lives of non monastic people. A Rule of Life is a guiding mission statement made by individuals, families, or communities. It is made in a process of prayer and discernment around how God is calling you to order your days. Inspired by the monastic rules of the Desert Fathers and Mothers and Christians monastic communities, such as the Rule of St. Benedict, Rules of Life help translate our faith into the habits and rhythms of daily life. The course is offered fully online but I expect to spend somewhere between a long weekend and a week on site at the Monastery in Cambridge.

I hope that the time of experimentation and focus will translate into a renewed ability to focus on spiritual practices and Scriptural grounding when I return to my ministry in the fall. In addition, I plan to share my learnings by teaching a small group to Falmouth Congregation UCC in either Advent 2024 or Lent 2025.




# MINISTRY OF Worship & Covenant


