When I had Julian I didn't really specifically think about her for about 4 hours. I had expected to be instantaneously in love, but I was tired and disoriented and dehydrated instead. It wasn't until hours after her birth (and some Gatorade) that I realized: I have a daughter. I have a daughter and she's perfect.

Epiphanies and realizations are sometimes instantaneous but, more often than not, they take time. We need to adjust, take stock, have some (literal or metaphorical) Gatorade, and get our heads wrapped around things.

The coming of the Christ to earth is no exception. There were some who got it immediately-Mary, Elizabeth, the Shepherds in the field. They are the stars of the Christmas story.

For some it took a bit longer. For those of us who need a minute there is a season just for us: Epiphany.

Epiphany is the season of slow discovery, where we travel with those who didn't get the memo in time for the manger but got there, just the same. We are invited to travel with the magi, who wander in the wilderness and miss the birth. We attend the wedding where Jesus performed his first miracle and turned water into wine. We stand with the crowd on the river Jordan and see the Holy Spirit come down upon Jesus and declare him the Christ.

Here at Falmouth Congregational we will honor the process of Epiphany by entering into a process of our own: praying, thinking, and journeying with our Star Words, or guiding words, for the year. In the month of January we will spend time observing ourselves and our journey with God, and choose a word that will guide and center us during 2022.

We will also be in the process of thinking about the year behind, and the year ahead, as we approach the Annual Meeting. There we will reflect on some of the changes that this year has brought to our community, and how we wish to continue in the year to come. I am thinking, specifically, about the growth of our church school, now hosting 20-25 children consistently each week. The church leadership is discerning ways to support this program and considering building upgrades and increased staffing to support this growth. Church leadership will have more updates this month as we continue to observe, reflect, and pray on this.

The Season of Epiphany is all about slow realization through paying attention. It is a season in which we are reminded that God doesn't give us just one chance at revelation, but a multitude. If you missed the memo on Christmas there are more miracles to observe—a star, a baptism, even a boozy party. The Christian journey is full of wandering and many a missed cue, but God will keep working in our world, again and again, waiting for us to be ready to notice.





The position is a permanent part-time (averaging 10+/- hours per week) year-round position for someone of the Christian faith (as defined within the abundant diversity of the tradition), with four weeks of paid vacation, and a competitive salary. In addition to leading the choir and musicians and performing on the organ and piano at Sunday worship and special services, the Music Ministry Director would attend midweek rehearsals with the choir (from September into June) and other musicians, short weekly meetings with the Pastor and staff, and quarterly meetings with the Music Ministry committee.

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Music Ministry Director would plan and lead music for weekly worship (offering hymns, prelude, postlude, benediction, offertory, introit, anthems, and prayer response) as well as special services (these could include Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Christmas Eve, etc.); play the organ and piano at the services; direct the choir and other volunteer musicians; help develop the youth music program; oversee maintenance of instruments and related equipment; and cooperate and collaborate with the Pastor, staff and the Music Ministry Committee. The Music Director would also be invited to play for funerals and weddings in our church community for additional compensation.
