

Dear Falmouth UCC,

It is officially summer, this short, sweet season of sunshine and mowed grass, ocean spray and ripe corn. We sent our children, and many of you, off to summer adventures on Sunday, knowing that this season comes with opportunities for rest, relaxation and renewal that sometimes bring us far afield. So, **are you resting?** Are you delighting in the blessings of summer in Maine?

If you are like me, resting might not come easy. You might find the calendar filling up, along with the sink, laundry basket, and to-do list. Despite our best intentions, summer time can become just another time of rushing, running, crossing things off.

But the Christian tradition offers a powerful balm in its tradition of Sabbath

**keeping,** passed down through our holy books and woven, even, into the story of creation. Sabbath keeping, setting apart time to intentionally rest, play, and restore, asks us to believe God when God says that we are beloved for who we are, not what we can do. To all who supported and participated in the Maine Faith Communities gun safety advocacy to the Maine Legislature -- thank you, thank you, thank you.

A valiant advocacy effort was made, but alas, the bills that would have done the most to reduce gun violence failed to pass. It was close, however.

Unlike in 2019, in this 2023 legislative session, both the background check bill and the bump stock ban bill passed in the House-- but then they fell short in the Senate. One gun safety measure did pass both the House and Senate and was just signed by the Governor, however, and that was the bill to impede the sale of guns to felons and other prohibited persons.

There is more work to do in the 2024 legislative year, to persuade more legislators that the proposed gun safety measures are supported by the majority of their constituents; are effective to reduce gun violence; are constitutional, and are not unduly inconvenient for law-abiding gun owners. 
