From Reverend Amelia Edson

My first job out of college was working as a Head Start teacher. Armed with an Economics and Policy Degree, I signed up with a program that placed recent undergrads in school systems that had trouble recruiting teachers (translation: no one else wanted the job). I found myself in a trailer in Arizona, surrounded by 35 four- and five-year-olds. The learning curve was steep. I immersed myself in learning about learning, and in understanding my young students' brains; what would they need to excel in their academic future?

One of the most important mindsets for academic success, I discovered, was a belief in malleable intelligence; the idea that people are not inherently smart, gifted at birth, but that through working hard we can change our brains and increase our intelligence. My kiddos learned songs about how to "grow their brains" and we chanted "Work Hard! Get Smart!"

I always think of those classroom slogans and songs when Lent rolls around. Lent, as a season, teaches the malleability of our spirits; we may not be inherently kind or generous, patient or self-controlled, but we can take on practices and habits that allow us to cultivate these qualities. While Lent is often portrayed as a season of deprivation, it is actually based on a profound hope for change and growth, and a belief that through refocusing on our spirits, we can become better versions of ourselves.

This season, our Lenten Learning will focus on one of our most valuable resourcesthe wisdom held in this community. All are invited to attend a Lenten Supper (full schedule below) where we will share a simple soup and bread meal and take turns sharing our stories by answering open ended questions designed to help us share our experiences of faith. We will listen, share, and learn, so that we may "grow our hearts" and "Work hard, Get kind!"

First a special thank you to everyone who was able to attend the Annual Meeting. We easily had a quorum with 54 members attending.

CHILI FUNDRAISER




