



As a young person growing up in a UCC church in southern Maine, I looked forward to Sundays when the family would all dress up and go to church together. Even at age 7, we wore bow ties and jackets every Sunday. My first memory of giving money to the church revolved around Sunday School and the offering plate that was passed around in each classroom. Before church, my father would give my siblings and me a guarter or two to put in the offering plate. One student was chosen each Sunday to pass the offering plate and return the plate to the office. Being chosen to return the plate made for a very special day. Sixty years later, I still remember the feeling of giving something of value to the church, a very special moment in my life. What is your story?

November kicks off our 2024 Stewardship campaign. This year's theme is "Our Money Story." We all have early memories of receiving a gift, giving a gift to someone, or donating to some deserving organization. How did giving or receiving those gifts make you feel?

"Our Money Story" invites us to talk about our financial giving. Money and possessions are one of the most common topics in scripture; Jesus talked about money more than faith and prayer. How we view money is a spiritual question. Thinking about God's story of money should be liberating, inviting, and transformative- it is a story of abundance and generosity. This stewardship season we will remember, release, reimagine, and restore our money stories so that we as a church can follow God and live the life God intends for us.

Each Sunday in November the sermons will explore this theme and we will also hear some of our congregation's stories on Sunday and in the weekly newsletter. We will explore our relationship with money during this time and some will share a story with our church family. Storytelling is sharing memories; telling the story can be transformative and comforting, as it is when we offer prayers of healing, gratitude, and love, for those in our community.

We have sent you a pledge card and we hope you will fill it out. You can also go to the church website and make your pledge online. As we go through this month of stewardship, think about some of your earliest memories of receiving something of value and how it made you feel. Then, prayerfully consider giving to support the life and ministry of your church. Blessinas.

But hopefully you've noticed how much better the exterior of the Church looks with new trim and fresh paint, so money well spent.

Speaking of money, our largest fundraiser, The Holly Days Fair, is right around the corner. I look forward to this event every year as I think it gets us all in the holiday spirit. Opportunities to help are abundant: you can bake, sew, secure silent auction items, donate books, puzzles, games, items for the boutique, etc. And of course, you can also come and shop and eat! COMMUNITY SUPPER

Due to the tragic events in Lewiston, the Community Supper put on by Falmouth's churches and faith communities was cancelled for 2023.

The importance of community was not totally lost, however, in that leading up to the event 188 people had volunteered to work together and provide and/or cook turkeys and squash and apple crisp, wait on tables, roll out the rolls, dish out the dessert, and clean up the kitchen, among other jobs.

In addition, many families fostered community by inviting neighbors over to eat together and share hope. In several cases the families had not even met their neighbors! At the last minute St. Mary's even changed the menu for their free Friday "Souper Supper" and instead served Community Supper food, including turkey, gravy, cranberry sauce, and peas.

Several years ago I was asked to speak in church regarding what is called a QCD, or a Qualified Charitable Distribution. Since it has been a while, I thought it might be good to go through some of the key points to doing this.

1. Are you at least 70 ½ and taking out money from your IRA's, for required minimum distributions (RMD's)?

2. Are you donating to the Church?

3. If the answers to 1 & 2 are yes, then you can do it more tax efficiently.

4. If you have the money sent directly from your IRA to the Church it is more tax efficient.

5. It still counts as part of your RMD, but any money sent directly to the charity is not taxable to you.

Because I like easy math, assume that you normally give the church \$5,000 annually. If you do that directly from your IRA to the church, you get credit for the RMD, but you pay no taxes on that amount. So, if your tax bracket is 12% Federal and 8% state tax bracket, you have saved \$600 in Federal taxes and \$400 in state taxes. So, you've saved \$1,000 personally, but the church has still netted the \$5,000. If you have any questions, I'd be happy to discuss it further. Larry Perry
