Kitchen Remodel Update

After many months of hard work from many people in the church, the new kitchen is finally open for business. We had some delays with back ordered items that held up the completion until now. Starting next week, when Matthew returns from vacation, we will be restocking the pots and pans and other cooking items now in storage.

The renovation idea was proposed almost two years ago at the 2020 annual meeting. Jeaneen Coleman did an awesome job raising the money to help make this wish a reality. Last fall we hired an architect firm, Harriman Associates, to work with a small committee of the church to design the new kitchen. The goal was a kitchen that was safe, easy to clean, and most important, workable for any event the church or community would require.

The largest investment was all new updated wiring and plumbing in the kitchen and a new electrical panel downstairs. No more fuses! We also installed a hand sink (required), vegetable sink, and a 3 bay sink. The old gas stove was rusted, so it was replaced with a new gas stove with 8 burners and two ovens. A new commercial dishwasher has replaced the old one, which we sold to a restaurant in Brewer.

New floor, new washable walls, new ceiling with LED lights, and stainless-steel tables, completes the kitchen remodel. The two retractable openings into Beinema Hall remain for serving. The entrance door was moved into the hallway from Fellowship Hall. Will have a finalized budget in the next couple of weeks, but right now it looks like we came in on budget!






Next Month: Christmas Card
