What if I told you that there was one habit that was tied to increased happiness, decreased risk of stroke, heart disease, dementia, inflammation, and suicide?[1] That a relatively simple practice, done even as infrequently as once a week, reduces the probability of being at risk for moderate to severe depression by as much as 20 percent? [2] That this one intervention is among the best known for both teenage mental health and adult deaths of despair?[3] And then, what if I told you that it was easy, free to access, and they had snacks, coffee, and live music?

I'm talking, of course, about going to church. Christians, especially Pastors, get squeamish about talking about these statistics—church is supposed to be centered on God; when we start talking about how positive outcomes it can sound like it is something we do for us, and that feels off. And yet, it is true that going to church is one of the best health and mental health interventions we have. In 1952, long before there was this data available, C. S. Lewis wrote "A car is made to run on petrol, and it would not run properly on anything else. Now God designed the human machine to run on God. God is the fuel our spirits were designed to burn, or the food our spirits were designed to feed on." [4] It seems that, in 2023, science is catching up to this insight.

This October come Get in the Game as we focus on jumping in and living our faith. It is good for us, good for our world, and the appropriate response to the incredible blessing of being a being in this beautiful, complicated world. Yours in Christ.




