From Reverend Amelia Edson:

For the month of October, the Grownups at Falmouth Congregational Church will be learning about Parables, and how parables are like mirrors — Jesus holds them up to us to help us see ourselves, and our world, differently.

The Children at Falmouth Congregational Church will be building "spiritual toolboxes," which will involve shoeboxes, lots of colorful paper, and learning some of the same parables the grownups will be hearing.

Taken together, these two activities are a good summary of the goals of Christian life — we come together to hear the ancient stories, and through them we start to see things in a different way. In order to get ourselves more in line with this Godfilled vision we begin a never-ending journey of transformation, where we use community, song, prayer, service, fellowship — and sometimes shoeboxes and construction paper — to draw closer to our loving and compassionate God.

Looking for ways to build your own spiritual toolbox? Here are a few: Come to worship early and breath in and out, seeing if you can feel God's spirit right down to your toes. Check out the Women's Book Group on October 2nd or the Men's Fellowship¹, volunteer at the Thanksgiving Community Supper on October 24th, or do puzzles with the children from Family Promise, whose families will call Falmouth Congregational Church their home October 27 to November 3. Sit in silence for 10 minutes a day, for as many days as you can. Go for a long walk in the woods and watch the leaves change.

Want more ideas? Come talk with me on any Tuesday, 12:30 - 2:00, and I will make you a warm coffee or tea and commiserate with you about the joys and challenges of cultivating spiritual practices.

Church, this October is full of ways to see the world differently and keep building our spiritual toolboxes — I hope you will join in on this adventurous journey!




We are celebrating the opening of our redecorated nursery!




