From Reverend Amelia Edson:

Dear Church,

What is the difference between wanting more and having enough? After our basic needs are met, having "enough" is totally subjective — it depends entirely on our perspective.

Most of us in this community have enough to eat, clean clothes to wear, shelter, and access to basic medical care. Many of us have vehicles, guest bedrooms, even money for dining out or going on vacations: We have luxuries that people in other parts of the world - even in other parts of our country - can only dream of.


Yet it is so easy to live our lives in a climate of scarcity. We compare ourselves to our neighbors. We are influenced by advertisements and external pressures that whisper that we need more.

The Scriptures invite us into another way of living.

Many early Christian communities relinquished all personal possessions and lived communally, sharing everything in common and relying on the goodness of God.

In the modern day, as we travel together through a very difficult year, we are surrounded by uncertainty. We worry about whether we have enough, whether we are enough, whether there will be enough to go around.

This October we will focus on the Christian Art of Abundance. We will travel with Scripture and reorient





ourselves around the notion of what it means to have enough. We will explore practices, including Stewardship Giving and prayer, that have helped Christians practice abundance across the centuries.

We will work to recalibrate our hearts towards gratefulness and faithfulness, drawing closer to the peace and true plenty that Christ calls us to. -Pastor Amelia, pastoramelia@falmouthcongregationalchurch.org

Pastoral Letter on Grief

September 23, 2020 Dear Church,

In May I wrote you a letter the week our nation reached a terrible milestone: 100,000 deaths from the COVID-19 pandemic. This week, just 4 months later, that number has reached 200,000.

I am tired, and angry, and often find myself in a state of disbelief that this is still happening, that there still is no end in sight. I grieve for those we have lost here in Falmouth, and my mind boggles at the sheer number of deaths, the amount of loss, that we are experiencing as a nation and world.

In a world that seems to be tottering on the edge of chaos and despair, I find myself ravenous for good news. I am hungry to remember hope.

In times like this I thank God for church community. When the world seems dark, I can talk to members of the church and hear about how you are taking care of each other, and yourselves. From folks volunteering at the Food Pantry, helping to homeschool grandchildren, caring for elderly relatives, doting over pets and creating beauty through sewing, music, gardening.... Talking with you all never fails to lift my spirits.

This past Sunday, being in-person with some for worship in the Sanctuary, and knowing others could experience praising God with us from home, felt wonderful. Simple pleasures: watching the leaves start to turn, planning for next year's garden, delighting in Julian's smiles and sounds, rediscovering the power of a good novel, recommitting myself to prayer practices—these are all sources of daily happiness.

This hopefulness is the reality I choose to focus on, for there is goodness all around us. Grounded in that knowledge I can go forward without being paralyzed by fear and despair. I can engage the overwhelming reality of the news and the grief, knowing that that is not the only truth around me.

Barbara Brown Taylor has said that one does not have to die, to experience the truth of the resurrection. One must only have laid on the dirt floor basement of one's heart, thinking that there is no way forward, and seen a sliver of light, a movement of the stone that had trapped you, a way to live again. As we keep on moving, through this grieving and hurting world, may we look for the places where light is coming through, and strength is being sent—for that is where God is.

I am grateful to be walking through this together, bolstered on all sides by our good and loving God.

I hope everyone is doing well and enjoying these last few weeks of summer. I just about froze driving to the gym yesterday morning. I love fall but I am not ready for the cooler temperatures!

We are all very excited to welcome Pastor Amelia back from her parental leave. I had the opportunity to meet Julian a few weeks ago (socially distanced of course) and she is just adorable. - We have hired an outside accountant, Doug Coyle, to help us maintain our finances. We feel having a third party doing this work is the right thing for our church and meets our fiduciary responsibility.
- We are applying for forgiveness on our PPP loan. Fingers crossed it is approved.
- We welcomed Jim Parr to the Council. He filled a previously vacated seat. We have one additional vacancy if anyone is interested. Please let me know.
- The Holly Days Fair will not happen as normal due to the pandemic. However, we are planning a modified virtual event that will include a virtual silent auction and pre-order sales of wreaths, baked goods and other items, which will be picked-up curbside. More details to follow.

I wish you all peace, happiness, and most of all, patience as we all find our way through this challenging time. Stay safe and healthy!




