

Hello, members of Falmouth Congregational Church!


I am delighted to be joining your community as Director of Youth

Hello, members of FCC! My name is Hannah Daly, and I am thrilled to be heading into our new school year as your Director of Children and Family Ministries. We have lots of exciting things happening - read on to find out what we have planned for your family this year!

- It's almost time for Kids' Church! Kick-off will be September 18th with an all-ages worship and a celebration after church!
- Regular programming will begin the following Sunday, running from 10:00 to 12:00 with an optional early pick up at 11:00. This year children will begin the morning in worship, and then move into our downstairs classrooms following the Children's Moment, where we will explore the stories of the Bible and God's teachings through art, music, movement, games, and more!
- This year, FCC is partnering with Foreside Congregational Church to offer a confirmation program for students entering 8th grade and up. 
