We have welcomed an asylum-seeking family, Marcello, Elvine, and baby Marcella, and supported them with housing, rides, and prayers. We hosted two unhoused families (16 people!) with Family Promise, and rejoiced with them as they both found permanent housing within a week of being with us. We have sent bags and bags of clothes to State Street Church (with more on the way!) and welcomed several visitors and new families to worship with us. At the August Coffee House, and during the Sunday offering, we have witnessed the talents of our friends and neighbors, as they have sung and played guitar, piano, and even saxophone.

As I look into the fall season, it is clear that the Holy Spirit (and all of you!) have a lot more in store. We are gearing up for the Church School Kickoff on Sunday September 8th, and the return of the Choir on September 15th. I am excited to officially become your Settled Pastor through Installation on September 29th and to welcome new members into the life of our church family that same day.

As we soak up these last few days of summer and prepare to face the new schedules and responsibilities of fall, let us continue to look for the Pentecost Spirit, calling us to new growth and inspiring us to lives of service, adventure, and community. We follow a God who is ever moving, ever present, and ever creating. What a blessing it is, to worship such a God, in such a wonderful community!

We are also starting an exciting new parable unit.

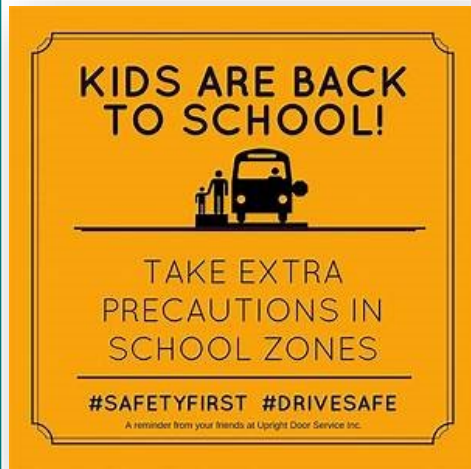

MOTORIST TIPS FOR CHILDRENS SAFETY

What Can I Do?



Do Not Pass
It is illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children.



Seeing Yellow
School buses use yellow flashing lights to alert motorists that they are preparing to stop to load or unload children.



Seeing Red
Red flashing lights and an extended stop sign arm signals to motorists that the bus is stopped and children are getting on or off the bus.



All Stop
Traffic in both directions stop on undivided roadways when students are entering or exiting a school bus.



Stay Behind
Traffic behind a school bus (traveling in the same direction) must stop.



Crosswalks
Do not block the crosswalk.



Distance
Stop your car far enough from the bus to allow children the necessary space to safely enter and exit the bus.



Never Pass on Right
Never pass a school bus on the right.



Look Out
Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, residential areas, playgrounds and parks.



Stop
Always stop when directed to do so by a school patrol sign, school patrol officer or designated crossing guard



Stay Alert
Children are the least predictable pedestrians and the most difficult to see.



Don't Honk
Don't honk your horn, rev your engine or do anything to rush or scare a child in front of your car.

When we do, the socks will be given to people who benefit from the Preble Street Resource Center and who would like to have dry feet and prevent infections.

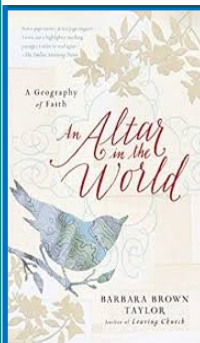
